Connections Group finally underway:



After a long delay, our team will begin contacting parish formation leaders over the next three weeks to begin the discernment process of finding a date and time for your first Connections session.

We apologize for the delay but our structural changes, especially around the areas of the pastoral priorities commission work, took much more time than had been estimated.

Below please find a few reminders about what we are trying to accomplish with your Connections Group.

- This first session can be in-person or virtual and at a time and day that is most convenient for the group to gather. Future gatherings can happen from two times per year up to four times per year based upon the desire of the individual Connections group.
- Our hope as we begin this process is to:
 - 1) encourage parish collaboration,
 - 2) work on common goals and pastoral opportunities found in local formation programming, and
 - 3) leverage one parish's strengths with another's challenges.

Healing and Deliverance Ministry Update:

Recently one of our PCLs brought to my attention a question on if adults who are part of a ministry team involved in healing ministries needed to have Virtus training. Upon investigation I discovered the answer is yes. Attached is the Guidelines and Norms for Healing and Deliverance ministries. I have attached the document to this e-newsletter.

The second paragraph under purpose and scope is clear about who this applies to, "These directives apply to any person within the Diocese of Des Moines assisting with Prayer Ministry for Healing and/or Deliverance in any public, private, liturgical, or non-liturgical setting."

Article 7 on page 5 indicates the requirement for Virtus training for team members. Since this is a dense document and you may have questions about your specific parish ministry, I suggest you contact <u>Deacon Tom Bradley</u> for guidance.
