New round of Synodal Listening to occur during Lent:



Please share the attached graphic in your bulletin, on your website or social media platforms, and in your e-newsletters to parishioners.

The Vatican and the USCCB have requested all Dioceses to hold a small number of listening sessions during this interim stage of the worldwide synodal process. Our listening session plan will build on the initial work that was completed which identified the six pastoral priorities in our strategic vision. See the attached graphic to read about the six pastoral priorities of the Diocese of Des Moines.

Our outreach this lent for the 60 minute session includes:

- A general Zoom session for those wishing to participate on March 11 (6:30 to 7:30 PM) and March 12 (2:30 to 3:30 pm)
- Youth session (in-person) Jessica Pancho is coordinating sessions
- Young Adult session (in-person) in progress

The two questions to explore are:

- 1. Based upon our six Diocesan pastoral priorities, (see attached graphic) where do I see signs of growth? Where do I see stagnancy or the Church falling behind?
- 2. Our mission is to help each baptized Christian to cultivate connections in Christ through encounter, friendship, and communion. What is needed in your local community to make this Christian vision come alive?

Apply for a Parish Mission Renewal Grant this season – opened on February 20:



What are those missed pastoral opportunities you would like to provide your parish community but can't due to your budget? Prayerfully consider applying for a Parish Mission Renewal grant this year.

In 2023, Parish Mission Renewal awarded \$10,000 to St. Patrick parish in Perry to revive Hispanic Ministry. Father Litto saw several areas where the parish was missing opportunities towards pastoral outreach and the parish budget wouldn't be able to meet the need. Since being awarded the grant they have begun parent faith formation nights, retreats, launching an RCIA

process culturally appropriate for Hispanics, and added to the Sunday experience with a Hispanic choir.

Other grants went to St. Patrick parish in Imogene for over \$5,000 to enhance the Sunday experience as they continue to implement Divine Renovation mission practices, and St. Ambrose Cathedral in Des Moines to develop a pastoral approach to family faith formation.

Tips and Tools on Disability for Catechists

Lunch and Learn sessions from the National Catholic Partnership on Disability webinar course Tips and Tools on Disability will be coming in April. Please complete this <u>survey</u> of dates/times that work for you.

The course is designed specifically for faith formation leaders, catechists, and anyone working with children with disabilities. The training provides practical insights, adaptable teaching techniques, and essential tools to create a supportive and inclusive

environment for learners with disabilities. Learn how to tailor lesson plans, nurture social and emotional well-being, and guide learners through sacramental preparation, ensuring that every individual's faith journey is embraced and celebrated. Each session will last around 20 to 40 minutes with discussion.



Sensory Friendly—Inclusive Family Masses:

Everyone is welcome in the parishes of the Diocese of Des Moines. However, there are a number of individuals with developmental disabilities, such as autism, that don't feel comfortable attending their "typical" parish mass for different reasons. Parishes hosting Sensory Friendly – Inclusive Family Masses (SFM) are going "the extra mile" to ensure that individuals with disabilities, their families and caregivers feel welcome, valued, appreciated, and supported. All are welcome to attend these masses - and it is an opportunity for the parish community to be supportive and demonstrate its concern.
