




Family Resources for Advent:

Attached to this e-newsletter are facilitation guides to accompany the Why Mass Video Series. A team of diocesan and parish staff designed the guides for parish staff who may be facilitating a group or use in RCIA, or for Pete and Paula in the pew at a parish who decides to form a small group, for use as a way of entering into Eucharistic Revival, for Catholic School

principals who wish to use this with staff, for parents to use at home with their family, or people who just want to use them privately.
